DUMONT TECHNICAL INSTITUTE - COURSE INFORMATION

SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAMS

CONTINUING CARE ASSISTANT	This one-year Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate program provides hands-on classroom learning and practical clinical experience. Practicums provide direct experience in home care, long-term care, special care, and acute care settings.
PRACTICAL NURSING	Practical Nursing curriculum includes concepts of health promotion, illness prevention, mental health, acute care, and rehabilitative care. Students gain hands-on learning experience with our in-lab classrooms, unique prep programs, small class sizes, and our highly qualified staff. Graduates of this two-year program receive a Saskatchewan Polytechnic/DTI diploma and are eligible to write the national licensure exam, register with the Saskatchewan Association of Licensed Practical Nurses (SALPN), and practice anywhere in Canada.
EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION	This Early Childhood Education Certificate Program is accredited through Lakeland College and gives you the knowledge and skills required to work in a variety of childcare settings, including early learning and childhood education centres, day homes, and preschools.
HEALTH ENTRY	Health Entry programs focus on creating opportunities for participants to acquire the skills required to work in the health region or health related settings. The program will increase the participant's workplace employability, essential skills, and prepare them for the workplace.
MENTAL HEALTH & WELLNESS	Mental Health & Wellness is a two year diploma program, certified through Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT). You will learn and apply Indigenous and Western-based holistic approaches to healing and addictions counselling.
OFFICE ADMINISTRATION	This one-year Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate program provides knowledge and skill development related to the business office environment with an emphasis on computer applications. Learners will receive practical and applied training in word processing, accounting, spreadsheets, communications, office procedures, employability skills and more.
HEAVY EQUIPMENT TRUCK & TRANSPORT TECHNICIAN	Heavy Equipment Truck & Transport Technician is a Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate program that provides knowledge and skill development in servicing, maintaining, testing, diagnosing and repairing heavy equipment, trucks, buses, and transport vehicles.
MULTI-SECTOR SAFETY TICKETS	Multi-Sector Safety Tickets is industry-certified training to provide students with the safety tickets necessary for workplace maintenance and potential employment across a variety of industries. These include, but are not limited to: mining, oil and gas, agriculture, and forestry.
PRIMARY CARE PARAMEDIC	The Primary Care Paramedic program is a one year Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate program focused on practical prehospital emergency care. Students gain hands-on experience through hospital and ambulance practicums and study areas such as medical and trauma emergencies, mental health, obstetrics, pharmacology, physical assessments, and cardiac and respiratory care.
BUSINESS CERTIFICATE	This one-year Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate program equips you for many entry-level roles. You will develop key business concepts and principles relevant to careers in accounting, marketing, management, human resources, insurance, finance, and entrepreneurship.

DUMONT TECHNICAL INSTITUTE - COURSE INFORMATION

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE)

Adult Basic Education (ABE) is also referred to as Adult Upgrading, and is an umbrella term that refers to a wide range of services, credit, and non-credit programs designed to help adult learners achieve their goals. These goals may include:

- increasing education and/or certification levels;
- gaining prerequisites for further training or employment;
- enhancing life skills, independence and self-sufficiency; or
- learning skills in specific areas (such as technological literacy, communication skills, or portfolio development).

There are four levels of Adult Basic Education in Saskatchewan:

LEVELS 1 & 2 (LITERACY)	In this program, DTI adults develop communication, numeracy, interpersonal skills, lifelong learning skills, and more recently may include workplace essential skills.
LEVEL 3 (ADULT 10)	This program is designed for people who want to build on their knowledge and skills. The Level 3 program consists of five subject areas: Communications, Social Sciences, Life/Work Studies, Mathematics, and Science. Learners who complete Level 3 successfully, go on to further education, training, or employment opportunities.
LEVEL 4 (ADULT 12)	An adult may attain a Grade 12 standing by successfully completing seven credit classes. Prerequisite requirements are waived for adults. Compulsory courses for Adult 12 are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• English Language Arts A30 and English Language Arts B30;• One Canadian Studies course (History 30, Native Studies 30, or Social Studies 30);• One level 20 or level 30 mathematics;• One level 20 or level 30 science;• Two electives at level 30 (one may be Prior Learning 30).

CANADIAN ADULT EDUCATION CREDENTIAL (CAEC)

The Canadian Adult Education Credential (CAEC) has replaced the GED® program in Saskatchewan.

The CAEC is a high-quality, made-in-Canada high school equivalency credential that meets assessment industry standards as a replacement for the GED®. The CAEC is for adults who do not have a high school diploma but need an education credential. It enables people to get a job, advance their careers or access other training opportunities, including apprenticeship. Employers, post-secondary institutions and others can count on the CAEC as a reliable indicator of Canadian adults' level of educational achievement.

The CAEC tests are delivered on an easy-to-use online platform. The tests will also support writers requiring access to learning accommodations.

The CAEC is tailored to the needs of Canadian adults and is reflective of diverse cultures and perspectives. It is available in English and French and consist of tests in the following subject areas: Reading, Writing, Social Studies, Mathematics, and Science.

Individuals who have passed some of the GED tests will be able to apply to the Ministry of Immigration and Career Training to have the tests recognized toward their CAEC for three years up to May 2027.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS FOR THE WORKPLACE

This program will address the link from academic education to employment focus by assisting Level 1&2 literacy learners in obtaining the academic and essential skills needed to find gainful full and part time employment. Subsequent objectives of the program are to provide adult learners, through work experience placements and safety training, an opportunity to gain full/part time employment.

Each Essential Skills for the Workplace program has a unique focus dependent upon community need.

SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES

The Gabriel Dumont Institute (GDI) has been administering scholarships for Saskatchewan's Métis since the early 1980's through the Gabriel Dumont Scholarship Foundation. Scholarships are awarded to Métis students who are Saskatchewan residents and are registered as full-time students at an accredited post-secondary institution. The programs are intended to recognize leadership, academic ability, financial need, and community involvement of students who meet the eligibility criteria for any or all scholarship programs.
